



HISTORY OF ELLIOTT ISLAND, by Hal Roth, 4 August 2004

Hal Roth presents a talk on the history of Elliott and surrounding islands including the families who occupied the area and the way they lived. The program is part of the South Dorchester Folk Museum's ongoing programs of oral histories.

Mr. Roth, a retired school administrator, is a well known and respected Eastern Shore author who writes and publishes articles and books about the Eastern Shore. His features have appeared regularly in "Tidewater Times" for the past several years and he has written occasional commentary in area newspapers. Additionally, Mr. Roth has published edited editions of "The Entailed Hat" by George Alfred Townsend and "Stories of the Eastern Shore" by John S. Hill.
